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CLOVIS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT SELECTED AS U.S. PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLAR

Clovis Municipal Schools is proud to announce that the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars has selected Clovis High School student, Rohan Angadi, as a U.S. Presidential Scholar. Scholars demonstrate leadership, scholarship, contribution to school and community, and outstanding accomplishments in the arts, sciences, humanities, and other fields of interest.

The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program was established in 1964, by executive order of the President, to recognize and honor some of our nation's most distinguished graduating high school seniors. One young man and one young woman are chosen from each State, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and from families of U.S. citizens living abroad. Each year, up to 161 students are named as Presidential Scholars, one of the nation's highest honors for high school students.

Rohan will be honored at the National Recognition Program (NRP) in Washington, D.C., in June at which time he will be presented with a U.S. Presidential Scholar medallion.
